BIONIC MAN OF GOLF™ SETS WORLD RECORD AT LOUISVILLE SLUGGER FIELD

LOUISVILLE, KY- **David Ogron** is a golf ball hitting machine. He hits lots and lots of golf balls. Very quickly. Ogron hits golf balls so quickly that he set a new outdoor world record over the weekend for most balls hit in 30-minutes, 1,388.

He pounded those balls in front of an awe-inspired crowd at Louisville Slugger Field immediately after the Louisville Bats baseball game.

“I’ve never seen anything like it,” said fan Sara Westerman. “The stamina it takes to stand there and hit ball after ball after ball is amazing.”

Ogron hit an average of more than 46 balls per minute to set the record. It’s not his first. He also owns a Guinness World Record for most balls hit in 24 hours. 10,392 golf balls! And he has also hit an astounding 6,971 balls in 12 hours and 2,438 balls in one hour.

The 30-minute record was achieved on the first stop of Ogron’s summer **Miracle Golf Tour** of baseball stadiums that includes Boston’s famed Fenway Park. Ogron, who attempts the records to raise money and awareness for the **National Children’s Cancer Society**, has been proclaimed the **Bionic Man of Golf™**. That title is appropriate because Ogron certainly doesn’t appear to be human as he strikes golf balls in rapid fire succession. He is sponsored by H&B’s **Bionic Golf Glove**, which recently received the Seal-of-Approval from **PGA Tour Partner’s Magazine**.

“While most golfers wear just one glove, I wear Bionic Golf Gloves on both hands,” Ogron said. “Bionic’s scientific design keeps my hands fresh and comfortable and keeps me from getting blisters and calluses while I hit thousands of balls. My hands would take a beating if it weren’t for the technology in the Bionic Golf Glove, a product that can help any golfer have comfortable hands.”

SO, YOU THINK IT'S EASY? THINK AGAIN!

Guinness has stringent requirements for setting world records. It's not like Ogron can stand there and hit worm burners all day. Each ball he strikes must travel at least 100 yards and land within a 30 degree arc in order to meet regulations set by Guinness.

According to Guinness, 9,352 golfers have attempted the 24-hour record over the years, and more than 45,000 have attempted the one-hour record. Ogron remains undefeated.
